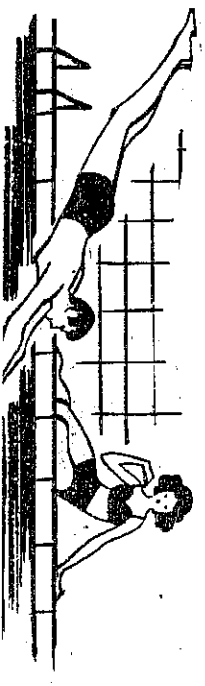

Workshops includes several scheduled ocean dives. Students provide only mask, fins and snorkel. All else—tanks, regulators and compressed air—is provided free by the Recreation Department.
